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LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT + CEO

To say that this year has been difficult would be an understatement. We have witnessed patients, families, and entire communities targeted by the malicious and inhumane policies led by this administration. From attacks on medication abortion and gender-affirming care, to the ongoing crisis of Black maternal mortality and the terror of families being torn apart and people disappeared by ICE, we know that these are not isolated events. LETTER FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

Each day at my clinic in Dallas, I care for people who are scared to even ask for an ultrasound, let alone utter the words, “I had an abortion.” I witness the consequences of laws written to scare and isolate people seeking healthcare. When I travel to other states providing abortion care, I serve people traveling hundreds of miles in every direction – healthcare that should be available in their own communities. Across this country, lawmakers continue to criminalize pregnant people, target trans and queer communities, and punish anyone who dares to provide compassionate health care.

And yet, every day, I also witness profound courage. Clinicians refusing to abandon patients. Communities organizing in the face of fear. People showing up for each other with love and defiance. That is the heartbeat of this movement.

We empower providers, amplify their voices, and build a supportive community to fuel bold, effective advocacy for bodily autonomy.

Grounded in evidence and experience, our physician advocates are essential to advancing policies that protect and expand access to reproductive health care.

Physicians for Reproductive Health is a physician-led national advocacy organization using medical evidence to promote sound policy and practice.

Since our beginning, we've made major strides in the fight for comprehensive reproductive health care—but we're not done yet.

Access to comprehensive sexual and reproductive health care, including abortion care, has always been core to PRH's fight. But with more threats to our collective health and wellbeing than ever before, we know that this is about so much more than the legal right to abortion care.

PRH skills up physician advocates across the country to make health care easier to access for all of us. We work with equity in mind, knowing that people of color, LGBTQ+ people, people experiencing poverty, immigrants, and young people always bear the brunt of systemic oppressions.

We don't stop at just making health care accessible; we aim to create a world where people feel safe to access the care they need. That means understanding the interconnectedness of bans on health care and the criminalization of people accessing and providing that care. That means advocating for changes in policy and procedure to address the maternal mortality crisis in our country.

This work is about all of us, and we are committed to advocating for a world where no one gets left behind.



KEY ISSUES

CONFRONTING THE MOST PRESSING THREATS TO REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

1

Abortion Care

As physicians, we use medical expertise and experience caring for patients to advocate for the right to access abortion care in communities without barriers, delay, or stigma.

The outcomes we seek:

- **Accessible Abortion for Everyone** – ensuring people get the abortion care they need with the resources and support they desire.
- **Patient-Centered Policy Protections** – expanding and protecting access to abortion through innovative policies.
- **Education and Destigmatization** – promoting abortion care as essential health care through educating the public and empowering providers.

2

Sexual & Reproductive Health Care

As physicians, we know that it is more important now than ever to advocate for a world where everyone has access to the care they need to live full, healthy, autonomous lives.

The outcomes we seek:

- **Gender-Affirming Care Without Barriers** – ensuring transgender, non-binary, and gender diverse people of all ages have access to life-saving care.
- **Healthy Pregnant People** – promoting solutions at clinical and political levels to ensure that people who choose to get pregnant stay safe and healthy.
- **Comprehensive Contraceptive Access** – expanding and protecting access to the birth control method right for each patient's unique goals.

3

Health Care Access & Equity

As physicians, we know that it is a critical part of our work to ensure that everyone, no matter who they are, accesses the care they need in a culturally competent, person-centered, trusting, and respectful manner.

The outcomes we seek:

- **Access to Care, Not Criminalization** – disrupting the cycle of surveillance, punishment, and carceral logic in the health care system.
- **Intersectionality In Practice** – practicing health care can't stop at abortion; from immigration justice to transgender justice to climate justice, we dream of a world where we're all free.
- **Equitable Resources, Equitable Outcomes** – advocating for person-centered solutions to health care that lead to everyone thriving.

PRH's reach extends beyond physicians interested in advocating for their communities. We are leading experts on advocating for policy, responding to legal threats, and keeping the people most impacted by restrictions and bans on health care informed about the current landscape.





LEADERSHIP TRAINING ACADEMY

BUILDING LIFELONG LEADERS

The need to make an evidence-based case for the importance of access to all reproductive health care has never been greater, and providers of reproductive health care and other physicians are uniquely situated to make an impact on these issues. The Leadership Training Academy (LTA) is our signature, rigorous, nine-month advocacy training

program; each year, PRH trains 25-35 physicians to give them the skills, language, and leadership abilities to be effective lifelong advocates for reproductive health, rights, and justice. Our courageous physicians speak out resolutely against abortion bans, targeted restrictions on abortion providers, and limits on sexual and reproductive health care access. The LTA program prepares physicians to be strong advocates throughout their careers by building their skills and confidence to speak out effectively for comprehensive reproductive and sexual health care.

The LTA Class of 2025 generated more than 125 national and local media hits, and provided testimony, met with state and federal lawmakers, and attended state and federal coalition meetings, collectively completing more than 200 advocacy efforts during their 9-month fellowship. In February 2025, LTA Fellows participated in PRH's annual Advocacy Day on Capitol Hill; Fellows and PRH staff met with 32 House/Senate offices. PRH also hosted a Hill reception in conjunction with the House Pro-Choice Caucus following the meetings, where staff from over 30 offices and 4 committees attended.

PRH has fostered a network of 560+ LTA alumni across the country seeking to inform the media and shape policy in their communities and in the nation.

Once they graduate, our alumni continue to work with staff as well as self-organize opportunities to use their leadership skills in the media, before policymakers, and in the public. PRH Alumni staff continued during the 2025 program year to prioritize creating opportunities for alumni to connect at conferences and in regional meetings, and to support them in advocating in front of the media, legislators, and the public, sharing the real impact of legislation of reproductive health care and to highlight PRH's expertise.

In September 2024, PRH's Policy and LTA Alumni teams co-hosted the first North Carolina Reproductive Health Summit. The half-day convening, held in Raleigh, NC reached 90 participants, received continuing medical education approval, and included six sessions with nine speakers, and was held in partnership with more than 15 local and national organizations.

The LTA Class of 2025 comprised 32 physicians from 23 states plus Washington, DC, as well as our first physician from Puerto Rico; and 5 specialties.

PUBLIC POLICY + COMMUNITY SUPPORT

ADVANCING POLICY FOR HEALTH, DIGNITY, AND JUSTICE

In a year defined by escalating attacks on reproductive and gender-affirming care, Physicians for Reproductive Health has remained a trusted voice for evidence-based medicine and human rights.


Our policy team organized more than 50 meetings with Congressional offices and sent over 100 communications to lawmakers urging action on the HEAL for Immigrant Families Act, the Black Maternal Health Momnibus, and efforts to block anti-abortion and anti-trans riders in federal spending bills.

At the state level, we worked with partners in Florida and Louisiana to stop bills that would have criminalized abortion care and restricted minors' access to health services.

In New York, our advocacy helped advance the historic Maternal Health, Dignity, and Consent Act, combating discriminatory drug-testing practices against pregnant people.

PRH also submitted an amicus brief in the Ninth Circuit challenging Idaho's total abortion ban under federal emergency care law, hosted a national webinar on misoprostol-only care, and convened 90 advocates and clinicians at our first regional summit in North Carolina.

Across every level of government, PRH is shaping policy grounded in compassion, evidence, and justice, ensuring that every person can access the care they need to thrive.

COMMUNICATIONS

ELEVATING THE PHYSICIAN VOICE IN A CRITICAL NATIONAL MOMENT

From July 2024–June 2025, the Communications team at Physicians for Reproductive Health focused on being responsive to the needs of our community in this moment. During this time, PRH was proud to have four exceptional, strategic, and values-aligned communications professionals supporting the needs of our physician advocate network, elevating the PRH brand online and in the media, and developing cutting messaging as our stakeholders took on rampant misinformation and disinformation about sexual and reproductive health.

Our Communications team was committed to showing up and speaking out: We pushed the Biden Administration to leverage their remaining time in office to support people who need abortions and transgender youth with a sign-on letter exclusively covered in HuffPost; helped our community prepare for the dangerous threats posed by the Trump Administration; and brought our community

members together to share the facts about the safe and effective misoprostol-only medication abortion regimen.

As faculty of the Leadership Training Academy, our team brought new curriculum to the Class of 2025, focused on addressing concerns about digital safety and security amidst increased surveillance, and normalizing and destigmatizing conversations around self-managed care including self-managed abortion.

We were absolutely elated to also undergo a 16-month process to refresh the PRH brand and build a new PRH.org that reflects the critical voice of the PRH community in this moment. The new site features a new, easy-to-use resource hub and ensures that the PRH brand reflects the trust and compassion the network of PRH physician advocates center in their fight to protect and expand sexual and reproductive health care.




